Pastor's Page

There is no doubt about it, life can be really tough sometimes and, on those occasions, there are moments when we just want to escape the circumstances or situations we find ourselves Presumably that is why travel agents are so busy in January because so many people book holidays in these first few weeks of a new year, because they need something to look forward to even if the holiday won't take place until the summer. For those who struggle with the seemingly never ending days of cold weather and grey skies, the prospect of heading off to warmer climates seems positively idyllic and yet, to my way of thinking and possibly because I've not yet experienced a holiday somewhere warm in the early months of a year, the prospect of returning back to a cold, damp English winter doesn't currently appeal. Feel free to convince me otherwise after reading this.

Psalm 9:10 says "Those who know your name trust in you, for you, Lord, have never forsaken those who seek you" I'm sure that this is a sentiment with which we all agree, and can even give examples of when we have trusted in God and He has not failed us. However I wonder, when we are in the midst of difficulty, do we find it easy at those times to trust God, to praise Him de-

spite what we are facing, to pray when we feel that God is not listening, to trust God when we feel that things are out of our control. So often, it's not until afterwards when we look back that we can give testimony to God's amazing presence, answers to our prayers, recognition that He was the strength that we needed when we felt weak.



I've been reading again the early chapters of Genesis, where we see God doing amazing things through the lives of Noah, Abraham, Jacob and so

on, and there were times when they built altars to declare God's faithfulness or to commemorate something amazing that God had done, and yet these were the same people who doubted God, who behaved in ways that were dishonest, deceitful or who seemingly simply didn't believe that God could do what He had promised, so tried to sort the problem out themselves. Yet somehow, despite that, God did work things out, God's promises did come true, regardless of the lack of faith, human interference and the wobbles along the way.

having God in my life. When times would get too difficult, I found it a comfort knowing that God is watching over me. For this I want to thank God by devoting my life to Him through this baptism.






I would like to end this speech by thanking my family and the church for leading me to have this wonderful opportunity to get baptized and finally feel worthy of calling myself a child of God.



Father Lord thank you for creating me in knowing my faith as a Christian preparing me for this day as I've become a child of God.


I give you thanks for protecting me spiri-
