With all the excitement and anticipation, or worry and stress, it's easy to feel overwhelmed with all that is about to come.



Good morning church.

My story is simpler than some of the beautiful testimonies I've heard before, but it's something that changed my life.

I've always felt like my life was an endless rollercoaster, and I could barely hold on. I always felt I was apart from those around me. Though I was frequently surrounded by people, I would feel completely alone and lost. People misunderstood me and I was made to feel judged all the time.

During one of these times I found myself in tears of frustration, but I didn't know what to do or where to turn. Everything seemed dark and hopeless, but then I heard myself calling upon God's name and I said: "Father, please, I can't do this no more, please help me..."

I felt calmness wash over me for the

first time, I realised that I needed to travel to see my family overseas. I told my partner and we booked my ticket. In the weeks leading up to the flight, I had a persistent feeling that the reason I felt compelled to travel to my family is because I'm going to die. I could not shake off this thought. On the day of the flight, this feeling didn't leave me. The three weeks I spent with my family, I didn't share my true thoughts and feelings with them. I felt intense sadness knowing I was soon going to die.

While I was there, I attended church with my sister and her family on Good Friday. Whilst I sat listening to the service the Pastor asked the congregation a question . "If you died today, do you know where you are going?" These words hit me so hard that my eyes filled with tears ... I realised I didn't know...but I knew this was where I had to be, to experience the love and grace of God ... I accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour. I was never alone, Our Father was always with me ... waiting for me to accept His hand and to walk the path prepared for me.



UNLOCK LONDON WALK 36



On Saturday 27th April we met at

Romford station alongside 8 others and made our way together to Raynes Park Station, and as the morning progressed our group of 10 became 13. This was our first Unlock London walk and we weren't to be disappointed. We didn't really know what to expect from the day but went with an open mind, comfy footwear and a packed lunch.

We were all given a map showing the circular route and all we had to decide on, as a group, was whether to walk clockwise or anticlockwise around it. There was also a Q&A sheet if we wanted to add some 'I Spy' to the venture! The real basics of the day were that we walked a distance of between 7-8 miles between 9am-5pm and stopped off at 7 different Churches along the way (having a tea or coffee at each one, of course!) This particular walk covered the Merton, Morden and Wimbledon areas.

At each Church, you could collect a well presented leaflet giving information on it and also current prayer requests. It was great to be able to look around the buildings and to talk to the volunteers representing them. You also got the chance to talk with others who were taking part in the walk too. It was wonderful to see the different activities

and approaches of the various Churches and to witness the various denominations of Christianity all open their doors and welcome us in. Each Church, although very different in their structure, share the same purpose of reaching out to God's people.

Each year the walk takes on a different theme and this year's one was 'Shining a Light'. Although we didn't really know Michael Eastman, who was the forerunner of this event, it was great to remember him as we walked and to see his light continue to shine on.

We took from the day new friendships and a real sense of belonging. We have already made a note of next year's walk date (25th April 2020) in the hope that this was the first of many London Walks to come. Hopefully next year others will join us for their first experience too. It will be great to represent RBC and Christianity en masse!
