Pastor's page

Today's culture is to seek to be the most important, the number 1, the one whom everyone looks up to or has to follow or obey. But the truth is, no one is number 1. The music industry is focused around who is the best, who is number one, and the arts are focused on who deserves the prize, and all the time the struggle for being the winner brings chaos, disquiet and frustration. The Baftas, Oscars and other award shows demonstrate this.

The Beatles themselves thought they were invincible, John Lennon said Christianity will go, it will vanish and shrink. I needn't argue about that; I'm right and I will be proved right. We're more popular than Jesus now; I don't know which will go first—rock 'n' roll or Christianity.

Sports people all strive to be the best, but often success brings personal disaster and self destruction, and at this point I could say something about politicians, but maybe it's best to steer clear on this one.

As we celebrate 70 years and not out of a Queen who serves the nation, we know that the Queen is often seen as number one, but she herself is someone who recognises the Lordship of Christ over her

and a need for a saviour. Central to her is her faith in Jesus.

Some of her words, "Although we are capable of great acts of kindness, history teaches us that we sometimes need saving from ourselves – from our recklessness or our greed. God sent into the world a unique person – neither a philosopher nor a general, important though they are, but a Saviour, with the power to forgive... It is my prayer that on this Christmas Day we might all find room in our lives for the message of the angels and for the love of God through Christ our Lord." (Christmas message, 2011)

"One of the things that has not changed all that much for me is the celebration of Christmas. It remains a time when I try to put aside the anxieties of the moment and remember that Christ was born to bring peace and tolerance to a troubled world." (Christmas message, 2006)

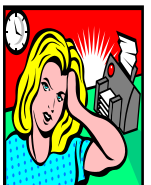
"To many of us, our beliefs are of fundamental importance. For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a frame-

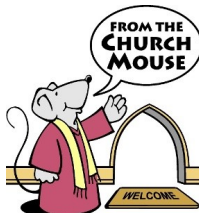

At what point in your life did you know that you were going to go into ministry? How old were you when you wanted to be a pastor?

I experienced a call to ministry when I was 19. 3 years later we were planting our first church. Before I was 19, though, I had been very active in my church teaching in the Sunday school and also leading the youth club (As the main leader.) The question, did I ever want to be a pastor, well even now I would not say I want to be a pastor, but with God's call I can do nothing else.

Do you have any doubts about God being real?

I have never had doubts about God being real, but my understanding of Him has often been wrong. I often made the mistake of trying to make God into someone I can fully understand and grasp. When I have got it wrong, it has felt as if God is distant, not that He has moved, I was looking in the wrong places

Can anyone join the church?

The church is open to all, but to be a member and so formally join, there are a few requirements

- That you have accepted Jesus as your Lord and Saviour
- Normally you would have been baptised by immersion as a believer

- It would be expected that you are living a life that is expected of a follower of Jesus

What are the passwords for all your apps?

Who do you love more, God or your wife? Do you love your Mum more than God?

There are different kinds of love, My love for my mom, is totally different from the romantic love for Vikki and my love for God is totally different again. In Greek they have at least three different words for love, expressing the different kinds of Love, in English we only have one, but we all know it feels different

Who is your most Godly child?

As both of my children were made in the image of God and by God, He put His handprint on both of them. Yes they both at times have made mistakes, as I have, but God made both my Daughter and Son special, just like us all.

Who is the better pastor? You or Vikki?

Vikki of course, I admire all her wonderful gifts and skills, she is also amazing that with all the obstacles that were put in front of her becoming a pastor, because she is a woman, yet she is still someone full of love and hope. I may not be too bad though!

I didn't, God did, I came kicking and screaming, yet God has blessed us through obedience.

What is something that you would like to change about the church?

I believe as a church the challenge is to become more relevant and more radical. It is easy to be a passive church, but God is calling us to greater things, we have been given much and much is required, if only we got together to do it.

How did you feel when you started preaching?

Petrified and honoured. I am not an academic and all the ministers and preachers who I grew up around were amazing, yet God chose me to tell the greatest story ever to a lost world.

What is your favourite Bible scripture?

Zephaniah 3:17, that tells us that God delights in us and surrounds us with comfort and singing. What a picture of peace for a person in a time of insecurity.

How old are you?

A dozen years older than the church secretary and 5 years younger than the church treasurer (also 49 years younger than one of the Parkside residents). England have never won the World Cup in my lifetime.

Who do you hate in the church/or you don't like being around?

Hate is a strong word, and I can honestly say, no one. Hate only eats us up. Some people wind me up, particularly those who spend their time finding fault with everyone or everything or those who sit doing nothing while disrespectful to sisters and brothers who are doing the job they are called to.
