#### **Environmental Stewardship**:


Write about how Christians can care for God's creation.



So much more to see and hear For a while just be and stand, Acknowledging and giving thanks For His amazing plan.





## Winter Gardens Baptist Church



We recently attended a Sunday service at our link church Winter Gardens Baptist church in Canvey Island and were privileged to join with Rev. Fiona Heddle as she led the service. We were shown around the recent build-



ing im-

provements and facilities.

The church is situated in a deprived area with many social needs and they are active in helping meet these in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ and to share His love with their neighbours.

They are a vital part of the local community and interact with them in a variety of ways:-

• They are registered as a Warm Welcome Space, open on Mondays from 1pm to 5pm. With free refreshments, Wi-fi, and phone charging.

- Their community Food Bank is run in partnership with Canvey Island Foodbank at Yellow Doors each Monday between 2 and 4pm.
- The Tiny Tot's and Friends Toddler Group on Mondays.
- Pop up Café events on Monday afternoons, which provides a place to meet new people over a cuppa and cake to chat, play a board game or just simply relax.

They have just begun their community garden project following on from the completion renovation of their old hut to become the garden room which Fiona Heddle said RBC very generously played a part in. It has been an amazing transformation and is already beginning to be a big help missionally, financially and for kid's work on Sundays. Fiona is immensely grateful for the support of our Baptist family in so many ways.

"We are hoping that all the wheelchair access paths will be in place by the end of September 2024 for the garden area and that it will be in its first season of planting. We are praying for

## **My Loaves And Fishes**

As Worship Group co-ordinator, I have the privilege of working alongside an amazing team of people; I am blessed to call them my friends. Aside from practising songs every Tuesday evening, we spend much time praying and sharing together. Our unity has grown ever stronger as we lift each other up in love. However, I wanted to share a personal testimony with you about a difficult decision I made just over a year ago. I hope it encourages you.

I've been able to sing for as long as I can remember. I was in my school choir aged just 7. I am not bi-lingual, as are many people, but music is my second language; it's just an inherent part of me. I sang in the Good Shepherd Worship Group for 12 years and have while I found a new church. However, when Christ-

mas came, I found it hard not to sing out all the carols so precious to me and my cover was blown. I joined the Worship Group, enjoying serving as a singer. I was tasked soon afterwards with co-ordinating the team and organising rotas. I was happy behind a mic - it felt natural and easy.

When Steve Thompson arrived, I loved singing along to his gifted piano playing. His departure was hard as we no



been performing songs written by my brother Peter for years before that. Upon visiting RBC, I was determined to stay 'under the radar' for a while, sit quietly and just be an 'invisible visitor' longer had a pianist at that time. I knew I could play the piano a bit (mostly nursery rhymes at work) but didn't feel anywhere near ready to fill such talent-

ed shoes, playing in front of a congregation. It was the Worship Group members who encouraged me to have a go. I resisted for quite a while, feeling I wasn't good enough to step up and play. However, God took me to task about this attitude. I kept arguing with God, saying my playing wasn't good enough and trying to steer my mindset into thinking singing behind the mic was where I should stay. But God wasn't having any of it! He quite clearly told me to give Him my meagre musical offering - my 'loaves and fishes'. God told me to offer what I had and He would do the rest, just like He did in the familiar New Testament story. It was a tall order for me. I had only sung in worship groups before, never been behind the keyboard. I was nervous. which was an unfamiliar feeling. God gently reassured me that my offering would be worthy, if from the heart. So I gave it a try. Tentative at first and feeling guilty for using the transpose button (sorry - I just can't play in E flat). The Worship Group instrumentalists encouraged and reassured me that it was OK, so I started to play more regularly and, just over a year later, here I am still playing. I still know my playing isn't at the standard of others, but I just handed over to God what I had and said "OK God. You told me to give You my loaves and fishes, so here they are. It's up to You now to do the rest."

I try in the usual human way to improve and practise and I often feel my efforts are sub-standard. However, God just keeps gently reminding me to keep giving Him my best and not to worry about what He'll do with my offering of serving in this way. He can do amazing things with so little.... which is just as well really.
