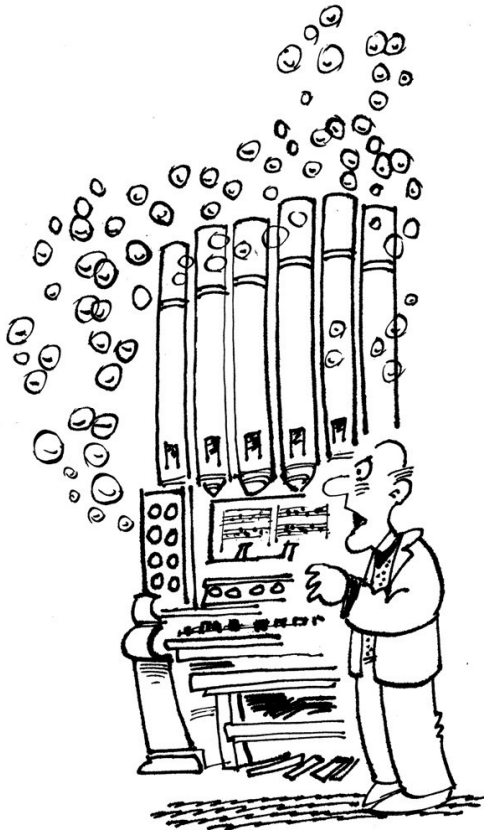

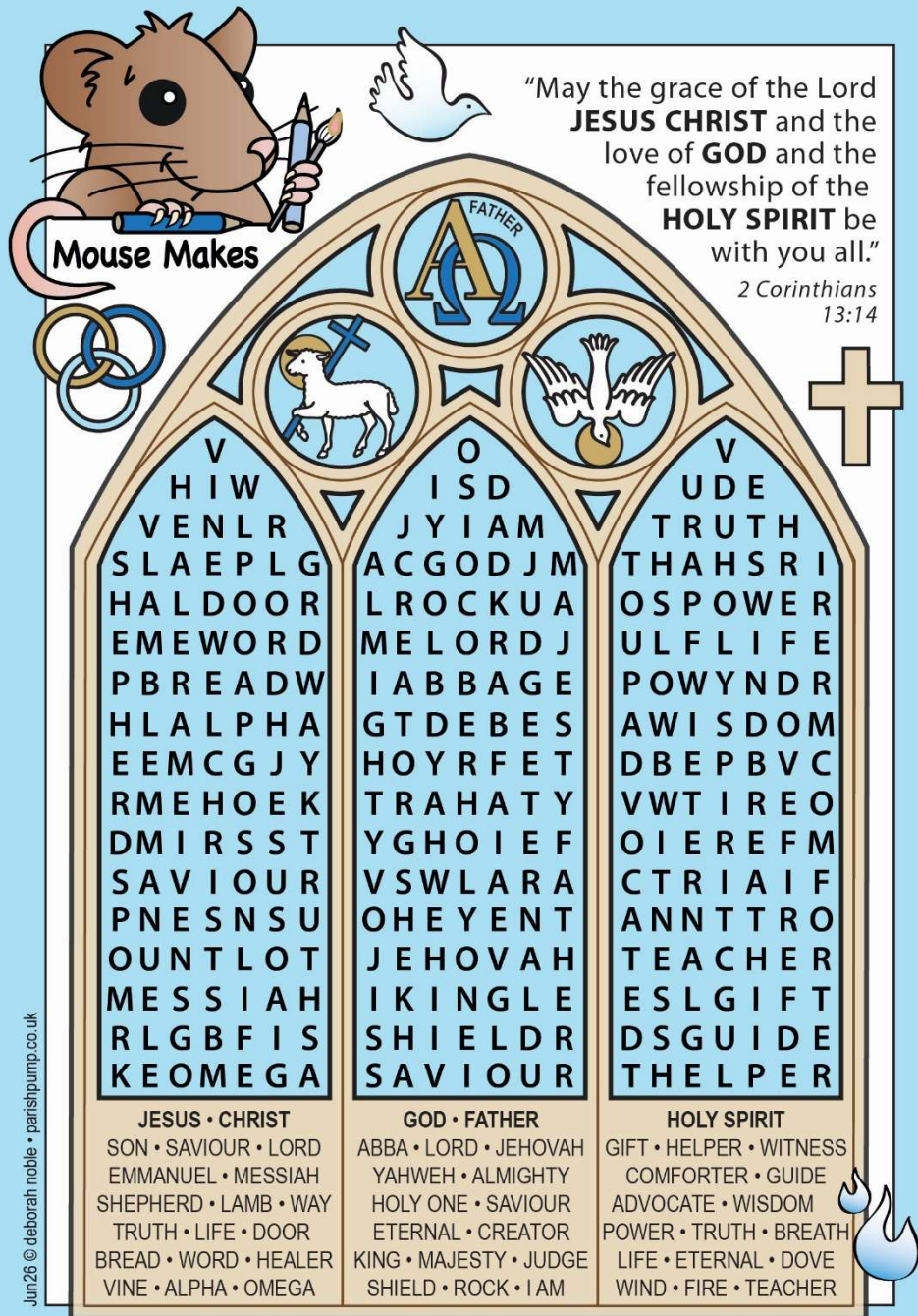

🌱 ❄️ ⚡

Across the early months of 2026, Ukraine's story is one of resilience, service, and enduring hope. Despite ongoing war, harsh winter conditions, and widespread uncertainty, communities and churches continue to stand as beacons of light—meeting needs both practical and spiritual.

The year began with one of the toughest winters in recent memory. Freezing temperatures combined with attacks on energy infrastructure left thousands without heat or electricity. In response, an extraordinary effort known as "Hope Heats Ukraine" mobilized hundreds of churches. Together, they provided warmth, shelter, and critical aid to

nearly 300,000 people. Churches became more than places of worship—they became safe havens where families could warm up, share meals, and find comfort.

* Fun Fact: Over \$600,000 was spent simply helping communities stay warm!

As winter gave way to spring, a shift in spirit began to emerge. While hardship remains constant, hope continues to grow. Communities are rebuilding homes, restoring roads, and, perhaps most importantly, renewing hearts. Even in frontline regions, churches are active—organizing humanitarian aid, running children's programs, and supporting soldiers and their families.

🌱 Did you know? Displaced communities have started at least 14 new churches—turning loss into new beginnings.

Life in Ukraine remains uncertain. Civilian casualties have risen, and daily threats persist from drones and missiles. Yet, in this uncertainty, many are rediscovering faith and purpose. Chaplains report a growing demand for Bibles and prayer materials, showing a deep hunger for spiritual hope amid crisis.

💡 Insight: In times of instability, people often turn toward meaning, connection, and faith.

At the same time, remarkable individual stories highlight the power of compassion. Families near the front lines have served thousands of soldiers by offering simple acts of care—warm meals, clean clothes, and a place to rest. Rehabilitation centres are helping people overcome addiction, rebuilding lives and restoring dignity.

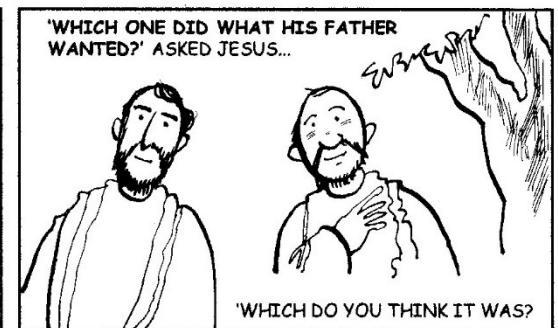
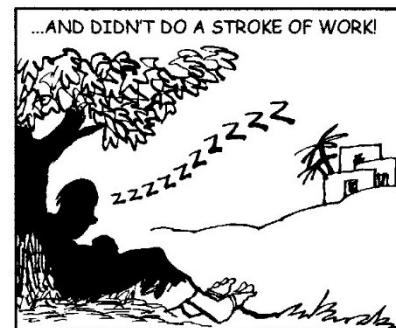
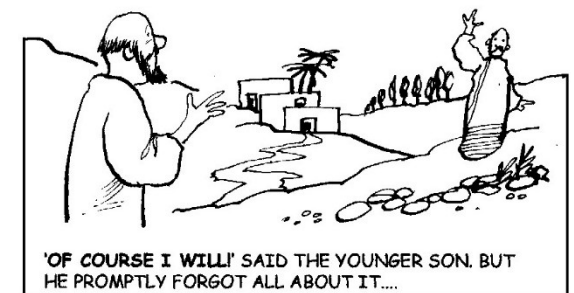
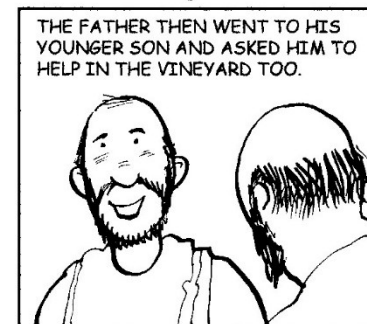
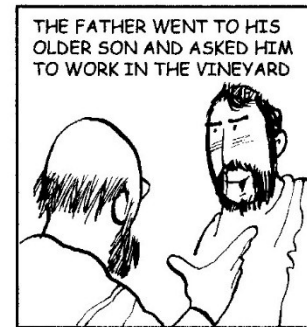
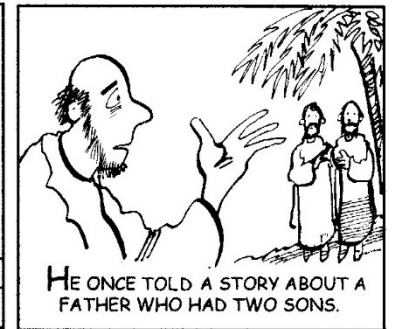
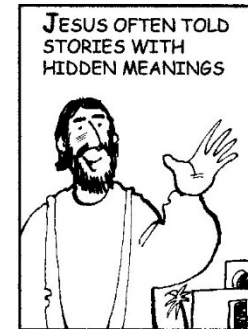
❤️ Impact Highlight: More than 70 rehabilitation centres are actively transforming lives.

Beyond emergency relief, communities are also investing in the future. Youth programs, leadership conferences, and support groups for families affected by war provide long-term stability and emotional healing. These efforts show that even in the midst of conflict, growth and development continue.

✨ The Big Picture: From winter survival to spring renewal, Ukraine's journey in 2026 reveals a powerful truth—hope is not passive. It is built through action, community, and faith.

As the months progress, one message stands out clearly: even the smallest act of kindness—a warm room, a shared meal, a listening ear—can become a source of light. And in a time of darkness, these small lights together are transforming lives.

What Shapes Me?

I don't know about you, but when I see a mannequin wearing an outfit, I try to imagine what that clothing would look like on me. Is it my style? My colour? Will it fit my body shape? (Which, if I'm honest, is usually not the same shape as the mannequin!).



A piece of clothing is displayed in the shop or in a catalogue to show its very best qualities so it will sell. If the dress in the picture were in a heap on the floor, I wouldn't be able to tell its shape or style. Clothing only has form and function when there is a person inside it. The clothing takes on the shape of the person wearing that garment.

When Christ lives within us, He inhabits our very being. Ephesians 3 verse 16 says "*I pray that out of His glorious riches He may strengthen you with power through His Spirit in your inner being.*" I pray often that my outward appearance and attitude are shaped by Christ living within me. Is He truly my spiritual mannequin, shaping me? Although my mortal body looks the way it does, if Christ

inhabits my inner being, then surely His presence should shape who I am too? In the same way a mannequin shapes a piece of clothing on a shop display, so Christ living in me should shape me also? I know when I put on a special outfit, it makes me feel different; confident and comfortable. With Christ living in my very being, I should feel that way too. I want my outer appearance to be shaped by the Holy Spirit which lives within me.

Pastor Ian Bunce once said "We are a free sample of Jesus to this world." We might be the only 'Jesus' some people experience. If Christ is living within me day by day, then surely that should shape my appearance, expression and my personality. Just as a mannequin shapes a dress, so Jesus should shape me as he dwells within my heart. As I've journeyed with God since giving my life to Him aged 11, responding as Christ instructed has become easier to navigate over the years. It does take practice. It's hard to leave behind my human responses, especially when revenge or reprisal seem justified. I'm not perfect at this skill by any means, but I've seen over the years how some Jesus-like responses have become a more natural part of my personality. I thank God for that, because it's only through His guidance, His Word, His strength, His

forgiveness and His perseverance with me that it's happening.

My prayer today is this. "Lord, please shape me. May Your presence within me reveal Your love and attitudes to those I meet." My physical body is still Sarah but I desire for Christ to be my

mannequin and shape me into the person he designed me to be.

"I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me." Galatians 2 verse 20.

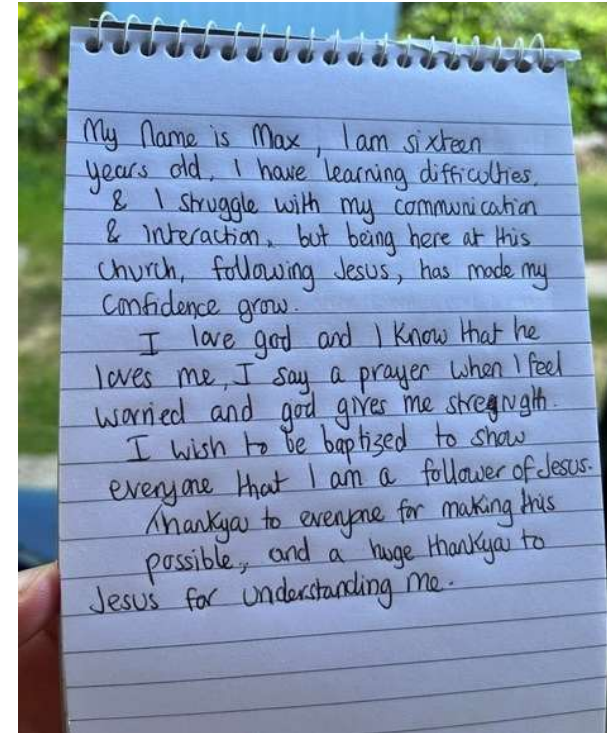

itself is sad and shocking, however, in terms of the Romford and Collier Row Foodbank, the increase of usage since 2019 has been 190%!! This is where the Micah verse comes in – we need to act, love and walk to support the foodbank.

The ways you can do that:

- Pray for those who attend the Foodbank and those who serve there
- Follow the work that Trussell does nationally and their lobbying to those in authority (and if you can get involved do so)
- Each week the notice sheet lets us know what food the foodbank needs, at the time of writing this article, each of this week's items can be purchased for a £1 or under (supermarket own version), can you add one item per week to your shopping list?
- Donate £1 per week (£4 per month) to the Foodbank, that can be done either via the offering bags, the card machine or bank transfer. All of this week's items (supermarket version) can (in total) be bought for under £4.00 (£3.26 to be precise!)
- Does your workplace do volunteer/ charity days whereby you can work for a local charity for a day? If so, could you come and

volunteer for a day for the Foodbank?

- When we hold our Lent/ Harvest/ Christmas appeals, can you share the list with your work colleagues/ family/ friends?
- The next time we hold a collection day in one of the local supermarkets, can you and your friends/ small group volunteer for an hour to help collect donations?



One final thought from the day was, we were reminded, when we look at the customers of the foodbank – it could so easily be one of us, and if it was? I would want to be helped by someone who acted justly, loved mercy and walked humbly with my God.

A short story from the Bible

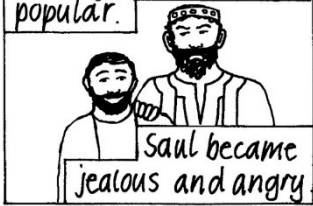
It can be read in the Bible in

Then David felt bad.

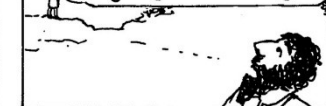


He is God's chosen king. Having the chance to do something doesn't make it right.

Trussell Foodbank Rolling Roadshow 2026 Dignity in Action

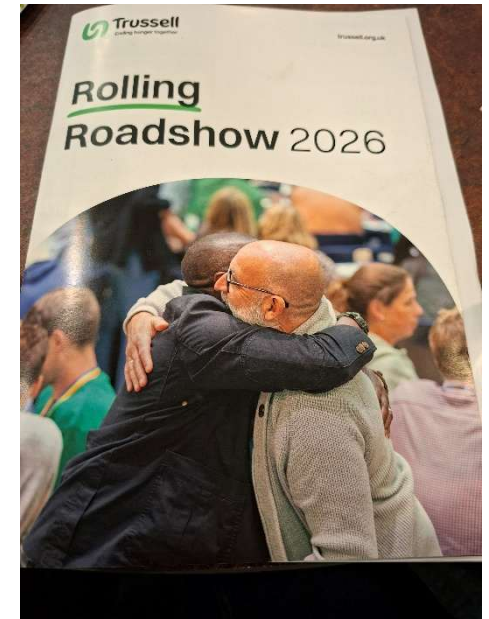

On Thursday 21st May, Alison, Ian and I attended the yearly Trussell Foodbank Roadshow which is an opportunity to meet with other Foodbanks and hear of what Trussell is doing nationally to raise the profile of Foodbanks to Central Government.

The theme of this year's day was "Dignity in Action" with the encouragement that when we meet and talk to those who attend our Foodbank sessions, to make sure they know "you matter, you have worth, you are human".

Alison and the Foodbank Team have been working hard to ensure that those who attend have a warm welcome, they are in a non-judgmental atmosphere and that it's a safe space to share. We were reminded on the day that hardship teaches people to apologize for existing, Foodbanks can help break that mindset. On the day we heard testimony from a Foodbank Volunteer who was once a customer

of the Foodbank, but because of the way she was treated (in a respectful way, treated with dignity) she was able to access support she needed and, as mentioned, now serves as a volunteer.



Now that I am back home from the event and I look to our Foodbank and think "How can we get involved?", I was reminded of the verse Micah 6v8 "And what does the Lord require of you, to act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God"

Since 2019, the average increase across the nation in terms of usage of Foodbanks has been 56% - that in
